Bob Graham



I was glad that I re-read Patrick White's *The Eye of the Storm* (\$24.95 Pb 608pp) before I saw the new film featuring Geoffrey Rush, Judy Davis and Charlotte Rampling - what a perfect cast! The film is a thrilling evocation of the story and I am filled with admiration for Judy Morris' screenplay. It was great to see all the stalwarts of Australian theatre working their magic. Only a pity Kerry Walker wasn't in there too!

I really enjoyed Alice Pung's second memoir *Her Father's Daughter* (\$29.95 Pb 238pp), which continues on from her first memoir, *Unpolished Gem* (\$26.95 Pb 304pp), which covered her adolescence in Australia and which won several awards - and rightly so! Alice Pung is a lovely writer, as well as a clever and thoughtful young woman. The second book develops into a horrifying tale filling out her father's memories of his time in the Killing Fields of Cambodia. These are not sensationalised and are all the more telling because of this. Highly recommended. As a matter of interest, we also have some **HSC Study Notes** for *Unpolished Gem* (\$12.95 Pb 144pp).





Another book I enjoyed very much, despite the harrowing details, was Mark Dapin's *Spirit House* (\$27.95 Pb 356pp), which tells the story of thirteen-year-old David's companionship with his seventy-year-old Jewish grandfather, a survivor of the Burma-Thai Railway. It is both deeply moving and funny, in that off-hand Jewish manner. It reads as a very authentic account of a terrible time. Also highly recommended.

An interesting and upsetting book was *Far to Go* by Alison Pick (\$29.99 Pb 309pp), which is about the treatment of Jews in Czechoslovakia in the late 1930s and the departure of a couple's loved little boy on the Kinder Transport to England. At first it seemed very personal and real, then came a declaration it was fiction, and finally the admission it was based on real family events. It was not entirely successful as a novel, but more than a little upsetting to see how easily fellow community members can turn into enemies.

An unusual subject for a book? I recommend *The Flight Attendant's Shoe* (\$49.95 large Pb 350pp) by Prudence Black, which turns out to be history of the changing fashions and mores in the airline industry. It is packed full of illustrations and will raise many memories for anyone who's been flying in the past fifty years. Find it in Australian History, although it could also be in Fashion couldn't it?

Twice *Miles Franklin Award*-winner Alex Miller has based his latest novel *Autumn Laing* (\$39.99 Hb 452pp) on the famous relationship between Sunday Reed and Sidney Nolan. I recommend you first read the article at the end of the book, *How I Came to Write Autumn Laing*, as you do need to remember that this is fiction, and not to be read as a real life story. With this in mind, you will enjoy a novel full of passion and verve and appreciate Miller's lifelong interest in art.

Of course I had a nostalgic time reading Michael Wilding's latest book. It is called *Wild & Woolley: A Publishing Memoir* (\$24.95 Pb 137pp) in a nice small format called *Giramondo Shorts* from Giramondo Publishing. In the 70s American dynamo Pat Woolley and Sydney academic Michael Wilding got together to start a small publishing business which made a huge impression in Australian literary life, publishing such things as poetry and the comics of Ron Cobb. They also began distributing American alternative authors such as Bukowski



and the Beatnik authors. Under Michael's influence they published some important literary books, not least the essays of Jack Lindsay. All gone now, in the face of constant change, but while it lasted it was great and this memoir will be of interest to many people.

A reminder about some really good Australian books this year, such as Anna Funder's *All that I Am* (\$29.95 Pb 320pp) and Kate Grenville's *Sarah Thornhill* (\$39.95 Hb 304pp), as well as Eliot Perlman's *The Street Sweeper* (\$32.95 Pb). Don't overlook Frank Moorhouse's third book in his Edith Trilogy, *Cold Light* (\$32.95 Pb 719pp), which finds Edith in Canberra wondering about her communist brother and hoping for a diplomatic post after her years at the League of Nations. This is a terrific and subtle story. There is a special offer too! If you don't have the first two books, *Grand Days* and *Dark Palace*, normally \$19.95 each, you can now get both of these for the price of one.

Of course I am going to get a copy of *The Horror of Love: Nancy Mitford and Gaston Palewski in Paris and London* (\$39.99 Hb 312pp) by Lisa Hilton. Everyone who has read the endless and amusing stories of, and by, the Mitford sisters will need to have this to complete the circle. Lisa Hilton has also written *Queen's Consort: England's Medieval Queens* (\$29.99 Pb 592pp). Take a look in biography under M for Mitford and you'll find some of the earlier books about this marvellously eccentric family. I notice one I haven't read before – *Irrepressible: The Life and Times of Jessica Mitford* (\$41.99 Hb 400pp). Jessica is the one who eloped with Winston Churchill's nephew to fight in the Spanish Civil War and was later a Communist Party member in America.

I am also getting a copy of *Soul of the Desert* (\$45 Pb 184pp) because the artist Philippa Nikulinsky is known to my son Donald and his partner Dorothy in Fremantle and they have given me a set of beautiful mugs and plates illustrated with bush plants by Nikulinsky. Co-author Steve Hopper is the Director of the Royal Botanic Gardens in Kew, England. It is much more than just a collection of wonderful identifying drawings. Really beautiful and very interesting.

Sad to hear that Di Gribble has died, aged only 69. She was a most influential and supportive person in the Australian publishing scene, loved and admired by many people. Remember the *Practical Puffins* which she and friend Hilary McPhee persuaded Penguin to issue? That was just the beginning. Many, many Australian writers were first published by Di. Her encouragement and support will be hard to replace.





