This could be her opportunity to re-enter the world of investigative journalism, something she wasn't aware she even wanted to do, and she begins digging into the victim's gambling past. But there's more to this crime than meets the eye, and Hallie soon finds both her job and her life on the line. (American)



Some of what he found appeared in Against All Enemies (Pb 24.95). Much more of it appears here. In an extraordinary geopolitical thriller filled with the kind of cutting-edge authenticity only someone on the inside could bring, Clarke takes readers just five years into the future, when forces in the Middle East and the US are at work to launch another war. But this time, it could be bigger. This time, it could be nuclear, and spread to Asia and beyond ... (American)

He confessed to 13 murders, but with no direct evidence to link him to the crimes, he managed to plea bargain his sentence down to 60 years for burglary. Due to a legal flaw in the Texas criminal justice system, Watts was supposed to be released from prison in 2006. Through the ceaseless efforts of investigators and the mother of one of the victims, Watts was finally tried and convicted to life in prison

for a murder he committed in Michigan in 1979. He remains the prime suspect in approximately 90 other slayings. (American)

Yet, despite the constant criminality of the gang, Queen also came to see the genuine camaraderie they shared. His lengthy undercover work totally isolated him from his friends and relatives, so the Mongols were the only

The Da Vinci Code (608pp Pb \$19.95)


This is a 'controversial' bestseller. Unlike many of our staff, I was immediately engrossed in this intriguing and compulsively page-turning story. Robert Langdon, a professor of symbology and a gifted French cryptologist, Sophie Neveu, are confronted with the naked and strangely arranged body of Sophie's grandfather, the curator of the Louvre. A pentagon has been drawn in his own blood around his navel, and his body is arranged in the fashion of Da Vinci's famous drawing of the Vitruvian man. Further clues and codes have been drawn around the body with a blacklight pen. Robert and Sophie must work against time (and the police) to crack a series of cryptic clues and codes. Along the way, all sorts of 'facts' about a secret society dating back to Leonardo Da Vinci,

(the Priory of Sion), a catholic sect favouring self-inflicted wounds, (Opus De and other fascinating subjects are sprinkled throughout. - Ann
