As Arlene Young's critical introduction demonstrates, the story unites many of the cultural and literary motifs marking the dawn of the twentieth century, when the Victorian era was giving way to modernity. Susanna GREGORY Conspiracy of Violence: Chaloner's First Exploit in Restoration London 502pp Hb 49.95

The dour days of Cromwell are over. Charles II is well established at White Hall Palace, his mistress at hand in rooms over the Holbein bridge, the heads of some of the regicides on public display. London seethes with new energy, freed from the strictures of the Protectorate, but many of its inhabitants have lost their livelihoods. One is Thomas Chaloner, a reluctant spy for the feared Secretary of State, John Thurloe, and now returned from Holland in desperate need of employment. His erstwhile boss, knowing he has many enemies at court, recommends Thomas to Lord Clarendon, but in return demands that Thomas keep him informed of any plot against him. But what Thomas discovers is that Thurloe had sent another ex-employee to White Hall and he is dead, supposedly murdered by footpads near the Thames. (English)



Early the next morning, however, as Decius and his friends are on their way to the trial. Fulvius's body is found slashed to death on the steps of the basilica, where the court will be sitting. Framed by a sinister Templar Knight for a brutal murder of a church official and accused of the theft of a priceless relic, he is forced to run for his life. But when his best friend Will is killed by the chasing knight, Petroc's flight becomes a quest for restitution. Trusting his fate to an enigmatic relic-hunter and scoundrel, he must dodge the long arm of the church and somehow get to the bottom of everything that has happened to him. (English)



Oxford: Crime, Death and Debauchery 213

Debauchery 213pp Tp 45.00 In the city of Inspector Morse, when it comes to crime, truth may be stranger than fiction. This walk through the dark corridors of Oxford's past is populated with footpads and prostitutes, murderers and conmen, thieves and philanderers. Brindley has searched the archives of the university, the Public Record Office, the Centre for Oxfordshire Studies and others to collect more than 100 accounts that paint a picture of Oxford's seedier side. Using contemporary court records and newspaper accounts, he brings together

crime stories dating from 1750 to about 1920, including: infamous murders, hangings and dying confessions, grand and daring thefts, escapes from the county gaol, suicide in the name of love, and great drinking deaths. (English)



Michael CONNELLY

Crime Beat 261pp Tp 29.95

"Death is my beat." Those words, spoken by the narrator and hero of The Poet (Pb 18.95), Jack McEvoy, could also apply to Connelly. Time and time again in these riveting pieces, we make the connection between crime reporter and novelist: "On the day I arrived in Los Angeles, I sat in the newspaper editor's office being interviewed for a job on the crime beat. The day before, there had been a bank heist in which the thieves had gone into the city's labyrinthine storm water tunnel system to get beneath the bank before tunnelling upward." Years later, that story would become The Black Echo (Pb 18.95). The cops, the killers, the cases - it's all here in a collection that is a must for Connelly fans. (American)

Roger DEPUE & Susan SCHINDEHETTE

Between Good and Evil: A Master Profiler's Hunt for Society's Most Violent Predators 308pp Pb 18.95

This is Depue's retrospective look at a life spent apprehending criminals - mostly serial killers - as a small-town police chief, Swat team member, Behavioural Sciences Unit chief, and developer of revolutionary law enforcement programs. The book also charts a spiritual odyssey that culminated in Depue becoming a Brother of the Missionaries of the Holy Apostles. While a seminarian, he counselled maximum security inmates. Following his time in the clergy, he reentered law enforcement and today heads the world's most elite forensics think tank, The Academy. (American)

Dale HUDSON & Billy HILLS

An Hour to Kill: A True Story of Love, Murder, and Justice in a Small Southern Town 275pp Pb 16.95

Churchgoer. Family friend. All-American boy. Murderer. Ken Register, much to the shock of the small town of Conway, South Carolina, was all of these things. Clean-cut, polite to a fault, and respectful of elders, Ken was the kind of guy parents wanted their daughters to date. But only months after a 17-year-old girl's brutal murder, the residents of Conway were in for another surprise. The killer was one of their own. 1999 (American)

Simon ILLINGWORTH

Filthy Rat: A First-hand Account of Courage in the Face of Police Corruption 234pp Tp 29.95

When Illingworth joined the Victorian Police Force, he wanted only to help the community. But because he spoke out against a corrupt sergeant, he was isolated, threatened and bashed by some of his colleagues. Undaunted by this intimidation, he spent four years working for Police Internal Affairs, weeding out crooked police. He received many commendations and brought successful prosecutions against corrupt officers. But the work took its toll and in May 2004, depressed and discouraged, he risked everything to tell his inside story to *Australian Story*. This book is a unique insight into the frightening world of Melbourne's gangland killings and police corruption. (Australian)

Road Kill 412pp Pb 16.95

From the files of *True Detective*, the premier US crime magazine, this book reveals the shocking facts about the killers on the road and the victims they leave behind. (American)

D J LEIGHTON

Ripper Suspect: The Secret Lives of Montague Druitt 197pp Hb 60.00

One of the most popular of all Ripper suspects, Montague Druitt appears on the surface an unlikely killer. Born into a comfortable bourgeois family, he was educated at New College, Oxford, qualified for the Bar and played cricket for a number of strong club sides. But there was another side to the agreeable Mr Druitt. He moved in the artistic and aristocratic circles that overlapped with London's secretive homosexual culture, was summarily dismissed from his post at a boys' school, and a few weeks later was found drowned in the Thames, just months after the Jack the Ripper murders. Six years later, Chief Constable Sir Melville Macnaughten named Druitt as the murderer and gave the unhappy barrister a kind of immortality. (English)

Robert MANN & Miryam WILLIAMSON

Forensic Detective: How I Cracked the World's Toughest Cases

240pp Tp 29.95

Some might say that Robert Mann, forensic anthropologist, deputy scientific director of the US government's Central Identification Laboratory, is the Sherlock Holmes of death detectives. In cases around the world, he has been called upon to unmask killers with nothing but the bones of their victims to guide him, draw out clues that restore identities to the nameless dead, recover remains thought to be hopelessly lost, and piece together the events that can unlock the truth behind the most baffling deaths. 
